TU students who are taking nine or more credits at TU in Northeastern Maryland have access to the fitness and wellness facilities at Harford Community College. A list of TUNE students eligible to utilize the fitness center, pool and drop-in classes will be sent to HCC at the end of the TU dropadd period each term.

Your TU OneCard must be presented to access the fitness center, pool and drop-in classes. Schedules will be available once classes begin at the start of each term. 

All TU students are required to confirm and/or update their local address online at the time of registration, at the start of each term and when their local address changes (within 15 days of change). It is very important to keep your address up to date for important information we cannot send electronically. MINIMESTER AND SUMMER SESSIONS

January minimester courses are offered on the main campus and at TU in Northeastern Maryland. The three-week session includes a variety of subjects relevant to TUNE students.

TU's summer sessions offer more than 900 classes, internships and independent study programs. The summer program is made up of four sessions with classes offered in a variety of scheduling formats and time frames to meet student needs.

There are a limited number of minimester and summer classes offered at TU in Northeastern Maryland. Class schedules are available online using TU Online Services. Check the academic calendar for registration deadlines. Be sure to consult with your academic adviser before registering for minimester or summer classes to ensure that the credits will count toward your degree. Remember that parking permits are required to park in the lots on the main campus.

Required orientation programs for students transferring to TU in Northeastern Maryland are held at the TUNE facility prior to the start of each term. During the academic year, NSFP and TU in Northeastern Maryland's director of student services support students' transition through a variety of programs and additional leadership development opportunities.

The OneCard is Towson University's official identification card for students, faculty and staff. The OneCard permits free access to most TU home athletic events as well as many main campus events and services. OneCard accounts can be managed online where students can deposit funds to use for purchases at the University Store and WEPA printing station. The OneCard may also be used in the main campus dining facilities, as well as stores in the University Union, Unitas Stadium and SECU Arena.

PARKING

There is no charge for parking at the TU in Northeastern Maryland location; however, some parking restrictions may apply when TUNE is closed for snow removal or special events. Certain spots are reserved for handicapped, fuel-efficient and carpool vehicles. Observe the signs and do not park in those spaces if you do not qualify. Cars may not be left overnight without permission from the HCC Department of Public Safety. Parking permits are required for everyone on the TU main campus from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m., Monday through Thursday, and 6 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Friday, when school is in session. Daily permits may be obtained from pay stations located throughout the campus. TU in Northeastern Maryland students who plan to be on the main campus for an extended period of time (i.e. taking a minimester or summer class) have the option of purchasing a student parking permit for the main campus. TU in Northeastern Maryland will notify students, faculty and staff of nonscheduled campus closings or emergency situations through the Harford Community College HCC AlertMe Emergency Notification System via phone, email and/or text messaging. HCC will activate the system based on the severity and potential for harm. Examples may include

- severe weather, including snow-related delays and closings. For weather-related delays and closings, the telephone system will not be used before 9 a.m. In those instances, students and staff will be notified via text and email.
- environmental emergencies such as hazardous spills, fire, explosion, etc.
- serious criminal activity with ongoing threat to the HCC and TU in Northeastern Maryland population.

Towson University uses a state-of-the-art emergency notification system to send messages to all registered text-message capable mobile phones, smart phones, wireless tablets and email addresses. 





