PLEASE make sure that if you are signing up for a topics course in a department with a generic upper-level topics course number, that you sign up for the specific course that qualifies for International Studies (such as ANTH 370-001: Environmental Justice). Some departments will have multiple topics courses under the same course number with different sections. If you sign up for the wrong topics course in any discipline listed below the course will not be counted as a qualifying course for the International Studies major or minor.

If there is a course you would like to take (or have taken), but which is not listed here, please have the professor send a syllabus or an email to Dr. Tappan (rtappan@towson.edu) attesting to the significant international component of the course. INST can then decide if the course is acceptable or not.
