Audition Requirements for Woodwind Instruments

Requirements

Incoming music majors and minors are expected to demonstrate technical proficiency and musical expression. The audition includes a short interview in which the candidate should demonstrate interest in and the potential to succeed in the field of music. Music Education majors should display significant interest in teaching.

In addition to a short interview, the required repertoire for the audition shall consist of the below items.

- All major scales and chromatic scale memorized. Scales should be played at a steady tempo in 8th notes at quarter note = 40 or faster in an articulation pattern of your choosing.
 - Flute: All major scales in two octaves. Chromatic scale three octaves starting on lowest
 C.
 - Oboe: All major and minor scales. Chromatic scale two octaves starting on lowest C.
 - Clarinet*: All major scales in two octaves, and three octaves for E, F, and G. Chromatic scale from lowest E to high G.
 - Bassoon: All major scales at least two octaves. Chromatic scale three octaves starting on lowest Bb.
- A prepared solo (repertoire can be unaccompanied or accompanied) of Grade IV or higher, such
 as those listed in the Maryland Band Directors' Association Handbook. Accompaniments for
 solos are optional and must be provided by the candidate when used. Solo repertoire examples
 include:
 - Flute: select 2 contrasting pieces in contrasting styles and tempos. Suggested repertoire: Sonatas by Handel or Telemann, Gabriel Fauré Fantasie, Paul Hindemith Sonata, Katherine Hoover Reflections, W.A. Mozart Concerto in G major, K.313 (exposition only), William Grant Still Summerland
 - Oboe: Apollon Barret etudes from Complete Method for Oboe, Wolfgang A. Mozart Concerto (exposition only), William Grant Still Incantation and Dance, Ruth Gipps The Piper of Dreams
 - Clarinet
 - Unaccompanied: Malcolm Arnold Fantasy, Jenni Brandon Chansons de la Nature, Kirsten Denny-Chambers This Time Tomorrow, Katherine Hoover Set for Clarinet, Willson Osborne Rhapsody, Roberto Sierra Cinco Bocetos.
 - Accompanied: Gerald Finzi Five Bagatelles, Augusta Holmès Fantaisie, Zenobia Powell Perry Sonatine, Marie-Elisabeth von Sachsen-Meiningen Romanze, Carl Stamitz Concerto No. 3, Carl Maria Von Weber Concertino or Concertos.

- Bassoon: Georg P. Telemann Sonata in F minor; Wolfgang A. Mozart, Concerto K. 191;
 R. Gliere, Impromptu and Humoresque.
- Two contrasting etudes. Etude examples include:
 - o Flute: Andersen, Drouet, Gariboldi, Hughes, Karg-Elert, Köhler. M. Moyse
 - Oboe: Barret Articulation Studies and Progressive Melodies or similar material
 - Clarinet: Kirsten Denny-Chambers Finger Fitness Etudes, Mauricio Murcia 30 Short Colombian Pieces, Cyrille Rose 32 Etudes or 40 Etudes.
 - Bassoon: Fifty Bassoon Studies from Julius Weissenborn's Method for Bassoon or etudes or melodic solos from <u>Método</u> lessons 2-15 or later.
- Sight-reading provided by the woodwind area.
- * If bass clarinet is the primary instrument, at least half of the audition scales and repertoire should be performed on soprano clarinet.

Requirements

Audition requirements for the BM in Music Performance are the same as the BS degrees; however, the addition of two or three contrasting orchestral excerpts is recommended.
