## **Proficiency Levels for Applied Lessons**

Discipline: JAZZ/COMMERCIAL TRUMPET

#### General Information.

- The stated proficiencies below apply to all students taking lessons in the particular discipline.
- Level of difficulty for specific repertoire will be adjusted based upon the student's degree program.
- These proficiencies are the minimums for a passing grade in the discipline.
- Any student wishing to take 300-level applied lessons must successfully pass an upper division jury demonstrating the proficiencies as articulated below.

#### Proficiencies for a 1-credit lesson

Each semester the student will be required to memorize and improvise on assigned composition and demonstrate improvement with sight reading.

#### Freshman Level

- ➤ Major scales and modes of Major
- > Blues scale and its possible applications
- ➤ Whole Tone scale
- ➤ Common 7<sup>th</sup> chords and arpeggios
- > Cycle of 5ths and 1, 2, 3, 5 patterns
- > Selected etudes from Concone, Kopprasch Book 1

#### Sophomore Level

- ➤ Melodic Minor scales ascending form only
- ➤ Harmonic Minor scales

- ➤ Minor Pentatonic scales ½-whole diminished scales
- > Improvising on Rhythm Changes and Blues progressions
- Selected etudes from Kopprasch Book 2

### **Upper Division Jury** (end of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester sophomore lessons)

> Proficiency in all material assigned in the first two years

#### Junior Level

- > Modes of Melodic Minor
- Modes of Harmonic Minor
- ➤ Whole Tone starting on any pitch
- > Selected etudes from Goldman Practical Studies and Charlier 36 Etudes Transcendantes
- > Junior recital (required based upon degree program)

#### **Senior Level**

- > Symmetrical augmented
- > Coltrane Harmony
- > Selected etudes from Smith *Top Tones for Trumpet* and Charlier *36 Etudes Transcendante*
- > Senior Recital (required based upon degree program)

#### Proficiencies for a 2-credit lesson

Each semester the student will be required to memorize and improvise on assigned compositions, transcribe at least one solo from a recording; and demonstrate improvement with sight reading.

#### Freshman Level

- Major scales and modes of major 2 octaves where possible
- > Blues scale and its possible applications
- ➤ Whole Tone
- > Common 7<sup>th</sup> chords and arpeggios
- > Cycle of 5ths and 1, 2, 3, 5 patterns

- Selected etudes from Concone, Kopprasch Book 1
- > Transposition up a major 2nd

#### **Sophomore Level**

- ➤ Melodic Minor scales ascending form only
- > Harmonic Minor scales
- ➤ Minor Pentatonic scales 2 octaves where possible
- > 1/2-whole diminished scales
- > Improvising on Rhythm Changes progression and Blues progressions
- > Selected etudes from Concone, Bach Cello Suites (Robert King), Kopprasch Book 2

### <u>Upper Division Jury</u> (end of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester sophomore lessons)

> Proficiency in all material assigned in the first two years.

#### **Junior Level**

- Modes of Melodic minor
- Modes of Harmonic Minor
- > Coltrane Harmony
- > Selected etudes from Smith Top Tones for Trumpet, Charlier 36 Etudes Transcendantes
- ➤ Minor ii, V, I progressions
- > Listening and survey of lead trumpet players and trumpet sections
- > Junior recital (required based upon degree program)

#### **Senior Level**

- Symmetrical augmented starting on any pitch
- 4 note structures and arpeggios
- > Expanded scale practice
- > 5 note structures and arpeggios
- > Selected etudes from Thomas Stevens, Allen Vizzutti and Marcel Bitsch
- > Senior Recital (required based upon degree program)
