She earned her BS in Chemistry at Towson University, and is a doctoral candidate in Bioenvironmental Science at Morgan State University. She evaluates data and makes determinations based on the requirements of the Toxic Substances Control Act, National Environmental Policy Act, Pollution Prevention Act, and other policies, and she provides scientific expertise and technical advice to internal and external stakeholders, customers, and managing officials.

Wendy Nelson, PhD "A geologist's timeline: My career evolution from "science something" to exploring volcanism by land and by sea"



Dr. Wendy Nelson is an Assistant Professor at Towson University in the department of Physics, Astronomy, and Geosciences. She earned her BS and her MS in Geology at Brigham Young University, and her PhD in Geosciences from Pennsylvania State University. Her research is motivated by the fundamental need to better understand the dynamic evolution of both the lithospheric mantle and the crust during geodynamic processes, especially those relating to melting and long-term lithospheric recycling.
